



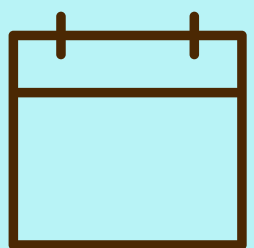

Abstract:

In June 2020, a special interest group on Terminology for Child Language Disorders (TCLD) was formed in pursuit of agreement in terminology and diagnostic criteria among researchers, speech-language therapists (SLTs), paediatricians and educational professionals.

The TCLD group produced a document in late 2021 summarizing the recommendations on the diagnostic terms and criteria to be used for child speech, language and communication disorders in Hong Kong. It was supplemented by a pre-recorded lecture and a diagnostic label exercise*.

An online forum was held on 10 December 2021 to let SLTs engage in an open discussion. Participants took part in the event actively to exchange views in relation to the diagnosis and terminologies used for child language disorders. They also raised questions on how they could apply the recommendations to daily clinical practice, too.
